V. PUBLIC COMMENTS

This time is reserved to the public to address the Inter Club Council on issues not already appearing on the agenda. During this time no member of the Inter Club council shall interrupt the speaker nor ask him/her questions. There will be a time limit of up to (2) minutes per speaker. Note:

Geoffery Stanfield: March in March will occur on March 22nd. This event will organize students to Sacramento to express the necessities of Community Colleges. Opportunities to meet with state Senators will be made available after the event. There is necessity for filling a bus that will leave at 6:00 a.m. on the side of the gym. Food and transportation will be provided at no costs. Senate will potentially give a \$100 incentive will be given to the club that creates the most attractive banner for this event.

VI. DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEMS

(5 minutes each)

- A. Brainstorm about team-building exercises:
 - Outdoor: Commit to create team builder for next week.

- B. Checking ICC Supplies:
 - Outdoor: We need to make ICC supplies more available.
 - Flor: Supplies have a tendency to disappear which is energy wasted, perhaps a key can be left at the front desk.
 - Outdoor: Any update on the banner machine.
 - Flor: The machine can be used for making posters, make a note that banners need to be e-mailed to me with 2 weeks anticipation. All banners need to be revised by me as well as a thirty-minute meeting with me in order for any banners to be made.
 - Democrats: What material is being printed on?
 - Flor: Regular butcher paper, although custom paper can be used but needs to be purchased accordingly. Paper that is purchased needs to be approved by me, because not all paper will work with the machine.
 - Outdoor: What ink is being used, and what is the lifespan?
 - Flor: The cartridges have a relatively long lifespan. Make efforts to use only black ink.
 - OLA: Do we have enough supplies?
 - Flor: Currently we have enough tape but other supplies such as paint need to be purchased.

- C. Use of less paper in SAC East:
 - Democrat: Perhaps taxes can be imposed for exceeding printing limits.
 - OLA: Codes have been implemented but the lack of a monitor has made it troublesome. Restricting the clubs is not a good direction to go through because the clubs are voluntarily existing.
 - AGS: As a club that goes through a lot of paperwork its hard, we are monitoring our forms and making efforts but still the number of members limits us.

Outdoor: Perhaps we could implement the 200 paper limit but enforcing a minimal fee could potentially be good.

OLA: While planning a graduation and scholarships its difficult to minimize our advertisement. Perhaps we can move our limit to 500 pages.

LLN: In agreement with OLA.

Democrats: Disagree, we need to keep track of our printing in order to keep expenses down. I agree with the 500 limit, but if a club exceeds we should pay for excessive printing costs, its not a huge burden and can be done.

GAMES: Agree with Democrats, we can help the green project and be help responsible.

CHEER: A 500 limit is good, we are willing to provide our printing ability to be given to other clubs.

AGS: We should have incentive to be sustainable with our actions. This is a great opportunity to be productive and efficient for our clubs.

Flor: Clubs can use paper for club purposes, but when personal copies are being abused and thrown around the offices then there's a problem. Be mindful of what copies are being made and how many are being printed. I'll consider the 500 limit, the finances are being derived from one place and if we can be efficient and use it for better practices this is important.
