What is a social problem? Who decides? How? This course will introduce students to the sociological study of contemporary social problems. Using sociological tools, concepts, and research, we will develop objective and systematic ways to approach the construction, causes, and consequences of social problems. Through small group discussions, hands-on exercises, and other collaborative work, students will be active participants in exploring how to use value systems, economic structures, political institutions, and social groups as a paradigm. As a final project, students will design and carry out an original research project based on social problems that are being addressed by local community organizations.

### SOC 3 Sociology of Race and Ethnicity

Examines the sociological dynamics of race and ethnicity in the United States, focusing on minority/majority relations.
