Frequently Asked Questions:

Who can attend Cabrillo College?

You must be at least 18 years old or have one of the following:

- ❖ a high school diploma
- ❖ a GED (General Education Degree)
- ❖ a high school equivalent certificate

Can I attend Cabrillo College if I am still a High School student?

If you are under 18 years old and are still in high school, you may take a maximum of 6 units each semester (some restrictions apply.) You need to complete the following:

1. An **Application for Admission and a High School Release form** (both must be submitted together): This release, available at your high school, must be signed by your principal or designee, your parent, and in some cases, a Cabrillo Counselor.
2. **Assessment:** an assessment test is required for English and math courses.

How do I enroll at Cabrillo College?

Fill out an application if you are a **new student**, a **high school student**, or have **not applied since spring, 2007**, and submit it to Admissions and Records office. The application is on pages **39-40** of this *Schedule* or apply online at www.cabrillo.edu

What day can I register for classes?

- ❖ Continuing Students begin registration on April 7, 2008.
(Continuing Students are those who registered during spring, 2008.)
- ❖ New, Re-entry, and High School Students begin registration on April 14, 2008.
- ❖ Registration continues until the day before the class begins.

When can I register?

Registration Hours (WebAdvisor & HawkTalk):

- Students may start registering on their assigned registration date and time. After that, students may drop/add classes between 6 a.m. and 1:30 a.m. seven days/week.

Can I still register after classes begin?

How does late registration work?

If space becomes available in a class on the first two days of instruction, you need to obtain authorization from the instructor, then take it to Admissions and Records office and register for the class.

What if I cannot attend the first class?

You must contact your instructor before the first class meeting and ask if you may remain in the class. If you do not attend without notifying the instructor, you may be dropped from the class.

How do I drop a class?

Use WebAdvisor online at www.cabrillo.edu or HawkTalk at (831) 479-4295 to drop a class. To receive a refund or have charges reversed you must officially drop any course on or before the first day of class.

To avoid a "W" grade, you must officially withdraw by 30% of the class meeting days.

To avoid an "F" or "NC" grade you must officially withdraw by 75% of the class meeting days. You cannot receive a "W" grade after 75% of class meeting days for summer courses.

Students receiving financial aid who plan to completely withdraw should file an **Intent to Withdraw Form** with the Financial Aid Office. It is the student's responsibility to drop a class. **Do not assume that you are automatically dropped from any class, or that your instructor has dropped you from the class.**

The class I want to take is full. Can I get on a waitlist?

Yes! If the class section you would like to take is full (closed) at the time you register, you may choose to be placed on the class section waitlist. **Be sure to update your mailing and e-mail address on WebAdvisor or you may miss out on important messages from the college.**

- ❖ You may add your name, without charge, to the waitlist.
- ❖ If space becomes available in the closed section, the first person on the waitlist will become eligible to register in that class section. You can do this by using the *Manage My Waitlist* to confirm your place in the class.
- ❖ Every effort will be made to notify you by e-mail or letter when a space opens up, but it is your responsibility to monitor your position on the waitlist and to register if a space becomes available to you.
- ❖ You will have 8 calendar days to register from the time the space becomes available, or your name will be dropped from the waitlist.
- ❖ Other students on the waitlist will move up and be allowed to register as space becomes available.
- ❖ **You can be on only one waitlist per course and you may not be both registered in one section and waitlisted for another section of the same course.**

As always, any student still on a waitlist when classes begin **must attend class the first day**, obtain an authorization, and complete the registration process by the deadline.

What if I'm not from California? What if I'm an International Student?

Students from other states or other countries pay higher tuition and fees. International student admission requirements are listed in the Cabrillo College *Catalog*. Please call (831) 479-6274 for information and appointments.

What are the residency requirements for Cabrillo College?

To qualify as a California resident, you must meet the following criteria:

1. You have lived in California for at least one year and a day before the beginning of the semester.
2. You can prove you intend to establish California residence by producing the state approved documentation to confirm that date. The list of approved documents is available online at www.cabrillo.edu and in the Admissions and Records offices at Aptos or the Watsonville Center.

In addition to the above, if you are:

1. **18 years old.** Both you and your parent have lived in California the required time.
2. **Under 18 years old.** Your parent has lived in California the required time.
3. **Not a United States citizen.** You can verify that you have applied for residency with the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) at least one year and one day immediately preceding the beginning of the semester, or you are on a visa that allows you to establish California residency.

Beginning January 1, 2002, AB 540 requires that certain nonresident students who have attended three years of high school in California and received a high school diploma or its equivalent, be exempted from paying nonresident tuition.

Remember: If your residency status changes from nonresident to resident while you are enrolled at Cabrillo. You must submit a new application for admission with a statement of legal residence and documentation to Admissions and Records at Aptos or the Watsonville Center. Do this the semester before your residency changes.

How many classes should I take during Summer sessions?

Full-time registration for summer is: **3 units** for four-week sessions, and **4 units** for the six-week session. Summer courses are taught in condensed time blocks, so you should carefully plan your schedule to permit adequate time for class and for study. During the four-week sessions, it is recommended that you take only one course. During the six-week session, students who are well prepared for college level study may enroll in two courses. Students who request more than six units must receive counselor approval prior to registration.

Do I need to take a placement test?

You must have a placement assessment score (or an equivalency) on file if you plan to:

- ❖ earn a degree or certificate
- ❖ transfer to a four year university
- ❖ meet course prerequisites
- ❖ take more than 6 units

Open Enrollment

It is the policy of Cabrillo College that, unless specifically exempted by statute, every course, course section, or class that is reported for state apportionment, wherever offered and maintained by the district, shall be fully open to enrollment and participation by any person who has been admitted to the college and who meets such prerequisites and selection procedures as may be established pursuant to Title 5 of the California Administrative Code, commencing with Section 55200. This Education Code permits restrictions for enrollment for High School students.

Can I take a course more than one time?

You may repeat a course under the conditions specified in the *Catalog*. If you want to repeat a course that is not designated as repeatable, obtain a course repetition petition from Admissions and Records. Obtain the appropriate signatures, if necessary, and return to Admissions and Records office before you attempt to register.

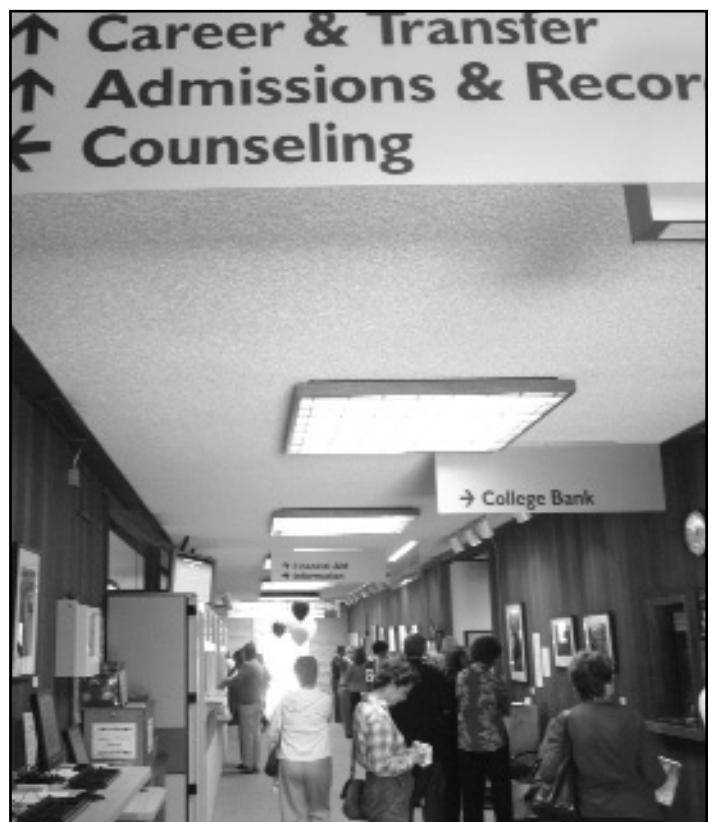
How can I get a transcript?

Tuition and Fees

Fees:

If you are a California resident, and you take one three-unit class during the summer semester your fees would be:

Mandatory fee \$20 X 3 =	\$ 60
Plus	\$ 13 Heath Services fee
Total	\$ 73

For non-residents of California tuition is \$174 plus \$20 per unit. For a non-resident to take one three-unit class during summer semester, your fees would be:

Mandatory fee \$174+\$20 X 3 =	\$582
Plus	\$ 13 Heath Services fee
Total	\$595

For international students to take one three-unit class during summer semester your fees would be:

Mandatory fee \$174+\$20 X 3 =	\$582
Plus	\$ 3 Capital Outlay fee X 3 = \$ 9
Plus	\$ 13 Heath Services fee
Total	\$604

The Student Health Services fee provides a variety of services. For more information, see Student Services or www.cabrillo.edu. Ed Code Section 76355 allows exemption from this fee solely to those students who depend upon prayer for healing in accordance with the teachings of a bona fide religious sect, denomination or organization. Board of Governors' Waiver (BOG) students will be charged the Health Services fee.

What if my fees are paid by an Agency?

If an agency or program is paying your fees, a voucher or "authorization to bill" must be sent instead of a payment within five days of registration. Check the box on the registration form to indicate your fees will be paid by an agency or program. Remember to keep a copy of the voucher or authorization. Cabrillo will send a bill to the agency or program. Fee-paying agencies or programs include (but are not limited to): CareerWorks, Summer Migrant Program, E.D.D., Disability Compensation, Veterans Programs, Employers.

How can I get a refund or reversal of charges for a class?

You must officially drop a class on or before the first day of class by using WebAdvisor or HawkTalk. Do not assume that the college or the instructor has dropped you.

If a class is canceled, your tuition and fees will be refunded. Refund checks will be mailed to your last known address (keep this information updated in WebAdvisor). MasterCard or VISA payments may be credited if you paid online by credit card. There is a \$10 processing fee charged on all refunds, except for canceled classes.

What is the deadline for refund/reversal of charges of transportation fees?

No reversal or refund of transportation fee charges will be issued after the first day of class regardless of whether the Bus Pass/Parking Permit has been picked up. If a bus pass or parking permit has been issued it must be returned to Admissions and Records by the first day of class for a refund/reversal of charges.

Oops. My check bounced.




A \$15 service fee will be charged for all checks returned to the college for account difficulties. If your check is returned, you will be notified by mail. Your registration and transcripts will be held until all delinquencies are cleared. Returned check delinquencies may not be paid with another personal check, but must be paid with cash, money order, or cashier's check.

Computerized prerequisite verification is required to enroll in Math.

All students enrolling in a math class must have in the Cabrillo computer system either Cabrillo math assessment scores, prerequisite course grade, or transcripts verifying their math preparation. It is strongly recommended that the prerequisite course work not be more than two years old. A minimum grade of "C" is required in the prerequisite course.

New students without transfer credit in math from another college must complete assessment in math before attempting to enroll in any math course that has a prerequisite.

New students with transfer credit in math from another college and high school students with math AP exam scores of 3 or higher do not need to assess but must see a counselor to have their records input into the computer before attempting to register.

High school students without appropriate AP scores must complete assessment in math.

Minors without a high school diploma may not enroll in Math 254, 254A or 254B.

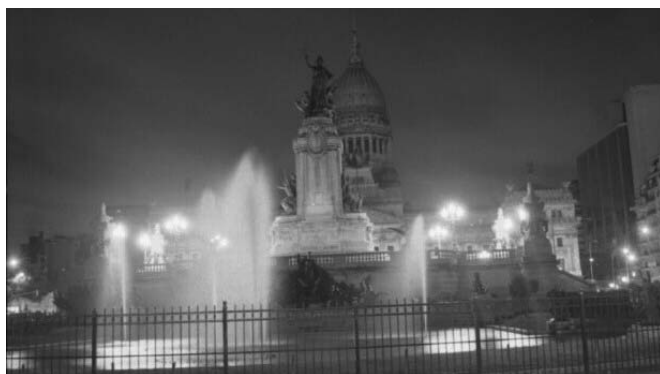

Financial Aid**The Board of Governors Enrollment Fee Waiver**

The Board of Governors Enrollment Fee Waiver (BOG) program is available to eligible California residents. Students who qualify do not have to pay enrollment fees, and pay \$20 for a parking permit. The BOG does not waive the health services or optional fees. To apply for a Summer 2008 BOG, students need to complete a 2007-2008 BOG application and submit it to the Financial Aid Office. BOG applications must be received before the last day of the term. Students who received a Fall 2007 or Spring 2008 BOG are automatically eligible for a Summer 2008 BOG. BOG applicants must meet one of the following conditions:

BOG A: At the time of enrollment, is a recipient or a dependent of a recipient of TANF/CalWORKS, SSI/SSP, or General Assistance. Current proof of benefits must be attached to the application.

BOG B: Meets the following eligibility requirements based on 2006 income and current household size. A signed copy of the 2006 federal income tax return must be attached to the application.

Number in Household Family Income

1 \$14,700

2 \$19,800 or less

3 \$24,900 or less

(Add \$5,100 for each additional dependent.)

BOG C: If you do not meet the conditions of BOG A or BOG B, you might qualify for BOG C by completing a 2007-2008 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Allow 8 weeks for processing.

REQUISITES & MAJOR CODES

What are Prerequisites, Corequisites, Recommended Preparation, and Limitations on Enrollment?

A **prerequisite** is a course or body of knowledge that you must satisfactorily complete or have before you may register in another course.

A **corequisite** is one that you must take concurrently with another course. When you register for a class requiring a corequisite class, you must register for both classes at the same time. If you do not register for both classes, neither class will be processed during registration. All other classes not requiring corequisites will be processed.

A **recommended preparation** is a course or body of knowledge that you should complete or have but are not required to complete before registering for a course.

Limitations on enrollment may occur for courses that involve public performance or intercollegiate competition, including but not limited to band, orchestra, theatre, competitive speech, chorus, journalism, dance, and intercollegiate athletics; courses that carry an honors designation; or blocks of courses or course sections designed to serve a specific student group.

Challenging Course Requisites and Limitations

Challenging course requisites and/or limitations requires written documentation that explains the alternative course work, background, and/or abilities that adequately prepare your for the course. You may obtain a Requisite Challenge Form in Room SAC West 213 or download it from the Cabrillo website: www.cabrillo.edu. Reasons for challenging requisites or limitations must include one or more of the following:

1. A requisite course is not reasonably available;
2. You believe the requisite or limitation was established in violation of a regulation or District-approved process for establishing requisites and limitations;
3. You believe the requisite or limitation is discriminatory or being applied in a discriminatory manner; or
4. You have the documented knowledge or ability to succeed in the course.

If space is available in the class at the time you file your challenge, we will register you for the challenged class and the District will make every effort to resolve your challenge within five academic calendar work days. The academic calendar is defined by the dates of fall and spring semesters - at other times of the year there may not be academic staff available to make the decision as quickly.

If no space is available in the challenged class at the time you file, the District will resolve your challenge prior to the beginning of registration for the next term. You may register in the challenged class during your normal registration period if your challenge is approved.

Prerequisite Course Requirements

All students are required to meet prerequisite standards prior to enrolling in courses with listed prerequisites. If you completed your prerequisite course requirements at another college or university, send your transcripts to the Admissions and Records Office or bring it to a counselor for verification.

COOPERATIVE WORK EXPERIENCE EDUCATION

Cooperative Work Experience Education (CWEE) offers students an opportunity to earn credit for on-the-job experience that is structured to meet the 'learning objectives' that they have developed with an instructor and their job site supervisor.

- Securing employment is the student's responsibility.
- One unit of credit is earned for every 60 hours of unpaid work or 75 hours of paid work. - For the summer semester, students may earn up to 3 units.

- CWEE 199G—General (non-transferable) CWEE—is for students who want to explore career and work experience opportunities. The job need not be related to the student's educational program or career goal.
- CWEE 99G - General (transferable) CWEE is transferable to certain Cal Sates but not to any UC's. Please check with a Cabrillo counselor as credit is limited to certain CSU campuses.
