Submission Guidelines

All short stories, novel excerpts, plays, screenplays, poetry, photography, and artwork must be received by December 1, 2009. Maximum two prose pieces (5,000 words each) and four poems per writer. Submissions must be typed, single-spaced, and single-sided—ONE copy only!

Your name should not appear on the hard copy. Please include ONE cover page with your name, address, e-mail, phone number, and title(s) of submission(s), as well as a duplicate of the files on a disc which does include your name. Also, please email your submissions to pgr@cabrillo.edu. For art and photography submissions, please have your name and contact information written on the back of each piece, and/or send them as an email attachment to pgr@cabrillo.edu.

All submissions, whether it's art or written work, must include a 2-3 sentence bio along with your submission(s). CD-Roms are acceptable. Originals of artwork and photograph may be retrieved at the public reading. Suggested reader fee donation of \$5.00 per submitter. Please make checks payable to PGR/Cabrillo College Foundation.
