Course Description:

Library 10 is designed to build life-long techniques for review and analysis of information sources including online catalogues, full-text periodical and newspaper databases, and websites, as well as library books and materials. You will apply the process of evaluation and synthesis and construct a works cited lists. You will learn about internet ethics and privacy and how to participate in online communities of learning.

Library 10 is a self-paced class, which means that you are responsible for keeping up with the content, meeting, and due dates. **You are responsible for submitting work on time and asking for help.** The course is structured around required reading in the Library 10 Handbook, quizzes, discussions, assignments, and a final exam in the Canvas.

Student Learning Outcomes

- Synthesize and apply evaluation techniques to select quality information sources from a variety of resources.
- Construct a works cited list using the Modern Language Association (MLA) standard.

Frequently Asked Questions

Are there any required materials for the class?

- Required Text: Library 10 Handbook. The Quizzes, Assignments, and Final are based on the material presented in this book, so you absolutely need it!
- You will also need a free Cabrillo Library Card for off-campus access to the library databases.
- You must use Canvas to participate in this course. You will need a computer with Internet access. Note: If needed, computers with Internet access are available for students to use on campus, for free, at the Cabrillo Library, Watsonville ILC and CTC, and at the Computer Technology Center (Bldg. 1400).

Where and when does the class meet on campus?

- You do not have to come to campus or the Library to meet with me. All course work will be done online.

How much time should I be spending on this class?

- As stated in the schedule of classes, the time commitment for this course is 3 hrs. 5 min. per week. To do well in the class, expect to spend an average of 3 hours per week on the course material.

What are the "Quizzes," "Discussions," and "Assignments"?

- Quizzes are untimed, but only 1 attempt is allowed, so take your time.
- Discussions are opportunities to interact with your fellow students and instructor about current events that are directly related to subjects covered in Library 10.
- Assignment 1 is a demonstration of your evaluation skills; assignment 2 is a works cited list that you will construct based upon a subject of your choosing. Both assignments are documents that must be uploaded to Canvas as attachments.

Can I submit work early?

- Yes. All lessons, quizzes, discussions, and assignments are available for you to complete from the very first day of class. Exception: You must wait to take the Final Exam (available starting December 4).

Can I submit work late?

- All quizzes and discussions will not be marked down as long as they are turned in by the last day of the final exam (December 11).
- **All assignments must be submitted on or before the due date.** If not discussed with me earlier, any assignments submitted after the due date will result in a 0 grade for that assignment.

How do I get help or ask questions?
